 - 3. Seventeen countries in the world speak Portuguese. We hope some of these leaders will go overseas in the future to Train Leaders and Plant Churches.



"Oh God, please encourage Adriana, or show me how to encourage her." Emma was praying for her friend on our worship team before she fell asleep. Thirteen year old Adriana was really discouraged, feeling an opressing spirit blocking her from enjoying life. Her Mom was always critical and degrading. She had lost her spark, quit smiling and quit playing volleyball. Life had lost its flavor.

"Hey Emma, last night I had a dream. God told me, 'You have a choice to make. You can either continue to be sad and beaten down and follow the ways of the world, or you can choose to follow me, and I will help you confront these things and overcome them.' All day I have been torn, not knowing which choice to make. I was fearful of committing my life one hundred percent to God. I did not even know if that was God's voice. I decided to do it. I will confront these sadnesses, with God's help."

That evening Adriana played volleyball, and joined in the fun of the Youth Group. "Last night I sensed a voice saying to me, 'You made the right choice. That was a good thing

you did today.' Were those just my thoughts? I wasn't even thinking about that at the time. They didn't seem like my thoughts. It seems like God is encouraging me."

Just over a year ago we (the Bergen family) were still doing survey trips and praying if God was directing us to Marabá. I made friends with a motorcycle taxi driver. I lost his address, but I knew of a little market where people knew him. Our whole family pulled up to this market to ask for directions

to Cleude's house. They ran and got their twelve year old niece to show us the way. It was quite a courageous act, for Adriana to climb into a car full of foreigners. She later told Emma how that came about. "Elda, my aunt, came running over to me and told me to show some people where my cousin lives. I assumed they were friends or relatives. I was watching TV and did not want to go but she insisted. When I got into the car I realized everyone was a foreigner. I was so scared. I couldn't understand a thing anyone was saying. I was convinced everyone was talking bad about me the whole time. I just smiled and agreed and nodded whenever anyone looked at me, and was very relieved to get out of the car two blocks later.

When we visit people, they say that there is no other church that is interested in youth and kids like The Vineyard. They think it is wonderful that the church has opened up a place for the kids to come and play and learn.
