Alone, But Not Alone

In this mission we have several missionary families serving in locations alone, as in there are no other foreign missionaries serving at the same location. Added to that dynamic is the distance geographically one from another. Though we work in conjunction with the nationals to plant churches, and develop relationships through the church planting, loneliness can hit because of being the only foreigners.

What can be done? How can you help?

There are several different avenues in which you can help missionaries. First is to consider serving alongside them as fellow missionaries. In Brazil, there are so many needing to hear about Jesus of the Bible. Relationship is an important value to the Brazilians, and they need to know that God wants a relationship with them. They need to see this divine relationship lived out; it speaks more to them than merely hearing about the love of God.

Secondly, you can support a family through visits. Consider joining a short term team that supports the missionary in what they are doing. Encouragement comes through the physical presence; participating and getting to know the location, culture, people and circumstances

of the area being served. This supports the missionary in a unique way.

Thirdly, you can encourage through regular phone calls, messaging or sending of care packages. The missionaries work hard to keep supporters in the loop of what is happening on the ground. Frequent messages of encouragement or a quick call to see how they are doing remind them that they are part of a team, not alone.

Prayer is important. Keep up on what they need prayer for. Pray for them often.


